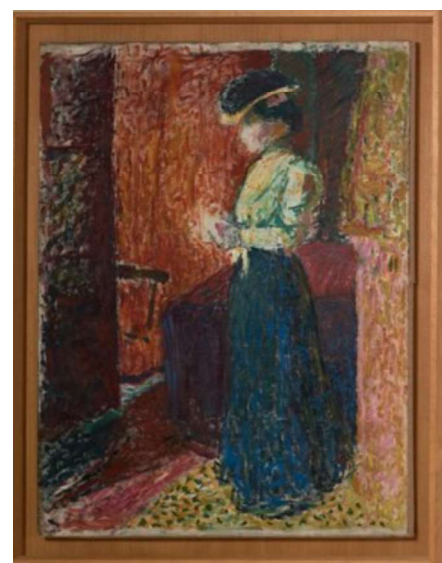
Thursday, May 29th CE Lecture, Nice and Cannes
