As we all struggled with coronavirus and its variants and adapted to new, and sometimes contradictory recommendations, I am pleased to report that our patient volumes have returned to pre-pandemic levels, with no confirmed patient to provider (or provider to patient), COVID-19 infections.



The last six months have been a busy and productive time for the department. For the first time in over 1.5 years, we met in Nashville to attend the AAOMS meeting. It was outstanding to mingle with colleagues again and enjoy the intangible benefits of in-person human interactions. All of our abstract submissions were accepted as oral presentations. This is a remarkable feat as most abstract submissions are delivered in the form of posters. Only the best abstracts are selected for oral presentations. Additionally, I would like to recognize Dr. Rachel Lim whose manuscript was selected as an award winner in the AAOMS Resident Research Manuscript competition (Figure 1). OMS faculty were also well-represented with Drs. Burke, Dillon, and Dodson delivering invited presentations (Figure 2). We hosted an alumni reception at the meeting that was well-represented with attendance from faculty, residents, and local alumni (Figure 3).

Although the 2020 Worthington Lecture was cancelled, we were delighted to host our 7th Worthington invited lecturer, Dr. Bonnie Padwa, who presented via a virtual webinar on November 3, 2021. Dr. Padwa is interim department chair and Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Harvard School of Dental Medicine and the Leonard B. Kaban Chair in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Boston Children's Hospital. She delivered a coherent and articulate presentation on the topic of non-bacterial chronic osteomyelitis in children. Fingers crossed. We are hoping to return to an in-person Worthington lecture in 2022!

PRE-DOCTORAL ACTIVITIES

With the beginning of fall quarter, we returned to classrooms in the School of Dentistry. We have been back in clinics for many months with appropriate PPE. We limit surgical patients to those who show proof of vaccination or have had anegative COVID test within seventy-two hours of their appointment. That got us through delta and I suspect it will get us through omicron also. Students and staff are all fully vaccinated but we are still quite careful, of course.

The return to classrooms was excellent for moral. It seems that students who grew up with online resources were tired of it and wanted to get back to in-person classes. Our faculty were also worn out by the extra work online education requires and the generally compromised result. It seems we have proven that dental education cannot occur without in-person student-teacher-patient contact. As if that need proving.

The other major problem we had was lack of patients. That problem has been solved. Patient flow has been good for the last couple of months. I suspect there is a backlog of dentoalveolar surgery in the community we just now starting to work through. If we are not derailed by omicron, we will be back to normal winter quarter.

We will have a new elective surgery course starting next fall. The course will be for fourth-year students and comprise additional clinical experience with liberal doses of pharmacology and management of medically compromised patients. We have had such courses in the past that have been popular with students, and I suspect that will happen again.

We welcomed new affiliate faculty fall quarter. OM3 Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons are rotating through Monday afternoons. Thanks to Drs. Kim, Wahan, Brady, Altmann, and Noblitt. Dr. Mark Stivers also joined our affiliate faculty this fall and has been generous with his time. Our students continue to enjoy the expertise of Doctors Jae Hong and Henry Rowshan. They have been with us for a number of years and continue to contribute mightily to our student's education.
