Dr. Zahid Lalani maintains active clinical practice at Northwest Center for Oral and Facial Surgery (NWCOFS) and was recently appointed as an ABOMS examiner. He also serves as the OMS representative to the rep to the WA State HCA Medicaid Dental Program and maintains an adjunct appointment at Manipal College of Dental Surgery. He received grant funding from the UW Population Health Initiative to measure the consistency of use of antiresorptive medications by patients with osteoporosis and osteopenia.

Dr. Kevin Lee is our most recent faculty appointment. He maintains a busy practice at HMC concentrating on ablative and microvascular reconstruction. Tom graduated from Loyola University Dental School in 1971. On January 29, 1971, Dr. Hohl was accepted into the graduate OMS program by Dr. John Gehrig. Tom completed his OMS training at University of Washington in 1974. Tom pursued a career in academic oral and maxillofacial surgery in addition to managing his practice, University Oral Surgery in Seattle. After selling his practice, Tom had the opportunity to pursue his passion for playing golf and spending time with his family in Hawaii. In 2003, Tom, with other alumni, were major donors and critical of the establishment of the Philip Worthington Endowment that resulted in the creation of the first endowed OMS chair in the department (11/23). 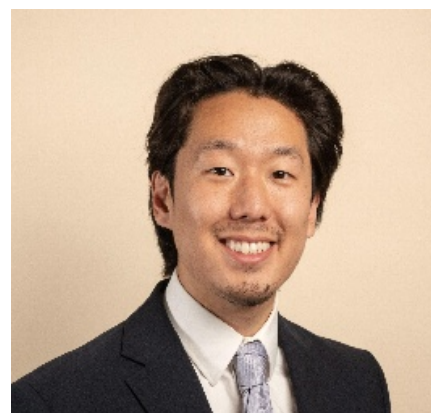
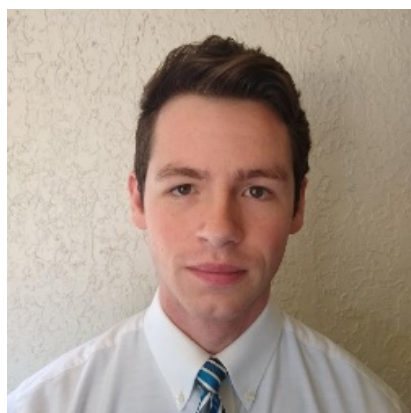
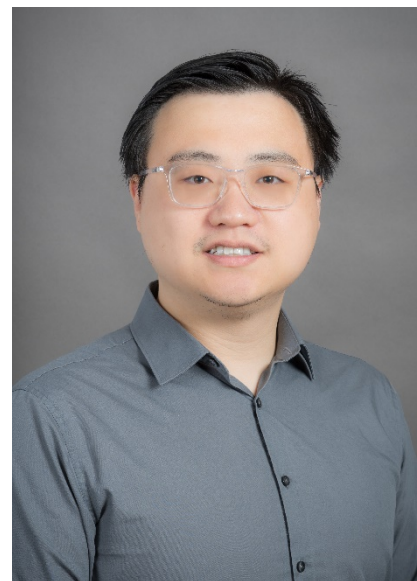
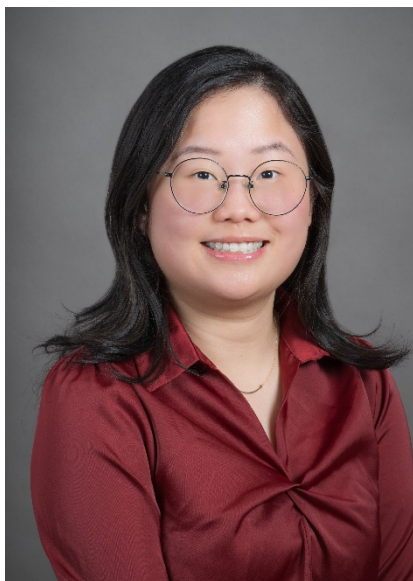


Figure 5 (above) – Incoming OMS Residents

PRE-DOCTORAL ACTIVITIES

Dr. John Evans

The predoctoral program will be revised in the coming year. The Clerkship model adopted in 2015 will be subsumed into a comprehensive didactic and clinical program designed for novice clinicians in the third year of dental school. The content of the didactic program will remain unchanged. It has always been quite robust in the belief that our colleagues in general practice need to understand the scope of our specialty and the procedures we offer. This would seem to be basic information that every dentist should have. In the new system the hours assigned to OS clinic will be unchanged. We will be in the comprehensive care clinic along with the fourth-year students.

We will continue to require students to pass a series of surgically-related competency examinations—local anesthesia, hard and soft tissue surgery, and prescription writing—prior to graduation. Three are patient-based and the local anesthesia exam is written.

We have gone to great lengths to calibrate our affiliate faculty who continue to be generous with their time. Thanks so much to all of you. Calibration in this context involves ensuring consistent grading criteria are applied to student performance.

Our clinical grading system will be changing from a simple pass/fail model to a high pass, pass, low pass, fail model. The four categories will be converted to accommodate the University's numerical grading system-- 0.0 to 4.0. The dental school tunicates that rubric asking students to obtain at least a 2.7 on the low side. Our average grade in the curriculum is well over 3.0. Our bell curve is markedly skewed to the right.

The School of Dentistry is increasing the size of our classes by eight to sixteen students in the net couple of years. This change must be approved by the Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA). This application will be completed this summer. Our pre-clinical laboratory (the famous D-1 lab) is being renovated this summer in preparation. We see no dark clouds on the educational horizon except for the potential for budget cutting by the federal government. As always, we appreciate our affiliate faculty and welcome applications from oral and maxillofacial surgeons who want to participate in educating the next generation of dentists.
