The School of Dentistry and the Restorative Department are proud to celebrate the extended service of **Dr. John Yae**, who has been at the UW for over 35 years.

Dr. Yae joined the Department of Restorative Dentistry in 1989 as a volunteer teaching faculty member, providing clinical supervision to pre-doctoral students in the Restorative Clinics for third- and fourth-year students. Later, he transitioned to teaching in the pre-clinical Operative series upon learning of the department's need for additional instructors. In 2011, he was promoted to Affiliate Professor, a volunteer role he held until 2021. He retired from private practice in 2020.

Dr. Yae now serves as an assistant course director for two pre-clinical Operative courses and as a co-course director for another. He has played a pivotal role in creating laboratory technique video recordings for the pre-clinical Operative courses. Additionally, he supervises students in the clinic and clerkship.


